The CTC tries to achieve this through organising competitions and other sporting and cultural events; arranging tennis workshops and seminars; and generally supporting the activities of member clubs around the world. It also strongly encourages the development young talent.

The Yokohama Tennis Club in Japan is hosting the CTC Asia Tournament in November. While BTC will not send a team to the competition we are happy that BTC member Linda Peltz will attend the event to represent our club.

In the last month BTC has welcomed guests from Yokohama and from the Roehampton Club in London to play and enjoy our facilities. Hopefully CTC member clubs will reciprocate for travelling BTC members who. wish to play while away from home. Please ask Rigo for an introductory letter if you plan to visit another

With the clubhouse being almost 100 years old, it has become apparent that there is considerable deferred maintenance with many building systems out-of-date. It has unfortunately become evident, through significant conversations with our architect, any improvements we do to the clubhouse trigger significant disabled access upgrades.

Typically, the club has taken the conservative financial path of paying cash for all construction projects, but the improvements envisioned to meet these code upgrades would take years to save for the funds, if paid on a cash basis. H&G is trying to determine how best to fund any future projects, and it is important that we have your input. Therefore, we will be sending you a 'Survey Monkey' in a month or so that we may better understand your opinion as to which projects should proceed and how these projects would be funded.
