Membership Meeting to Discuss Court Colors

There will be a special meeting of the membership of the BTC on Sunday

November 17th from 2 to 3:30 in the Ball Room to discuss the best choice of colors for our ten courts as we resurface them.

On October 4th Chip Moreland of Vintage Courts presented factual information about court surfaces and coloring, along with examples. At this meeting members will be given a chance to state their ideas and opinions on court colors at BTC. I hope you can attend. There will be a vote of the membership to inform the Board about the wishes of the majority of the members about court colors.

Cafe at BTC

It is hard to imagine the BTC without our cafe. The cafe provides members and guests with healthy food and beverages at fair prices with unsurpassed convenience. The cafe is not a money maker for the club, as a matter of fact members' dues subsidize the costs of the food and the salaries of the staff that prepare and serve it. The volume is small compared to cafes that serve the public, so to keep prices low some subsidy is required. In past years the subsidy has been around \$20,000, but projections for this year could make it \$50,000. The subsidy to the cafe includes catering for many club events where food is served to members at no direct cost to the members. The club saves the cost of a caterer for those events.

A larger volume of diners would definitely reduce that subsidy, since the cost of labour, equipment, utilities, and supplies are relatively fixed. Starting this month our chef, Brian Ollendorf, and his staff are creating one new and original lunch special with suitable wine pairings every Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Here are some examples with the prices:

1) Roasted Salmon Club Sandwich served with Arugula Salad for \$8 or \$11 if paired with a glass of Sauvignon

Blanc

- 2) Open Face Meatloaf Sandwich served with Roasted Garlic Mashed Potatoes for \$9 or \$13 if paired with a glass of Cabernet Sauvignon.
- 3) Carolina Pulled Pork Sandwich served with Homemade Coleslaw for \$8 or \$12 if paired with a Pinot Noir or Chardonnay.
- 4) Carne Asada Street Tacos served with a Black Bean Cilantro Salad for just \$6 or for \$9 when paired with a Central Coast Zinfandel or Argentinian Red Blend.

I hope you will sample one on the new lunch specials and patronize our café so that it can continue to be a vital part of our club. A suggestion box is on the counter by the cafe window. Please write your creative ideas for ways to improve our, including menu recommendations, and put them in the box. And let Brian, Chris, and Alexandra know if you appreciate the lunch special.

Reliance on Initiation Fees for Club finances

Initiation fees account for about 8% of the income of the Club each year. This year we budgeted for \$100,000 in initiation fees on total revenue of just over \$1.3 Million.

This is the same budget for initiation fees as last year. Our goal is to generate between \$200,000 and \$250,000 of annual net income (before depreciation and capital expenditures). We did this last year and we are on track this year.

CFO Report October 2013

Fellow BTC Members,

We are four months into our fiscal year, which begins each June. Some members have asked for an update on the Club's financial situation and as your CFO I will try to address the key information requests I have heard. If you would like to address any financial matters related to the Club, please let me know and I am happy to discuss any ideas or concerns.

The financial health of the Club is strong. We have more cash in the bank than at any time in the last few years (\$ Affordability of Additional Personnel

Your Board of Directors and Finance committee have the objective to run a lean organization that balances service to the members and cost efficiency. We discuss this often. Our total payroll budget for this year is up less than 1% over last year. Some staff members have chosen to reduce their time commitments or have left. We are replacing these hours with new people. We will ensure we meet our overall budgets this year.

Capital Improvements

Over the last several years we have been successful in making substantial capital improvements to the Club facilities (decks, ramp, etc.), while eliminating all debt, increasing cash, and keeping dues low. We have had dues increases of 3% or less each year for each the last five years.

The House and Grounds Committee is exploring long-term facilities visions and options to improve the Club. Thinking through long-term facilities planning is important as we face some near term structural necessities (seismic, ADA, etc.). We want to limit unnecessary and expensive rework. Any significant changes that exceed required thresholds will be subject to a vote of the members. This is required by our bylaws and is the right
